In 2022, our community celebrated being together again with COVID restrictions gradually lifting over the course of the year. As it became safe to travel and reunite with loved ones, the long-term health and economic impacts of the pandemic began to unfold. With inflation making the basic cost of living challenging for more families across the Hampton Roads community, nonprofit agencies were some of the hardest hit organizations, facing significant challenges over the course of 2022. Many nonprofits saw an increased need for their services as well as increased cost to provide those services. Langley Federal Credit Union and the Langley for Families Foundation were uniquely positioned to support our community's most impactful nonprofit partners, ensuring critical resources and services were available for our friends and neighbors in need.



In 2022, Langley for Families Foundation donated over \$1,000,000 to nonprofit organizations supporting those in need in the communities we serve! This brings the Foundation's total impact to \$4.62 million since its founding in 2014.



COMMITTED TO HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Langley prioritizes mental health and physical wellbeing for our members and the communities in which they live, work, and play. Through partnerships with non-profit organizations and clinics, Langley supports healthcare as a right for all.

Langley reaffirmed its commitment to mental health in the third year of its five-year



pledge to Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters' (CHKD) new mental health hospital.



CHKD's mental health hospital opened in 2022 with outpatient and inpatient services having started in April and October respectively.

Located in downtown Norfolk, the new mental health hospital is making a significant impact in the community by filling a muchneeded gap of services. The hospital includes 60 inpatient beds, an extensive expansion of outpatient services, and training for mental health professionals.
